Called Together Diocesan Appeal Update

We have continued to have a couple of slow weeks, partly due to the postal strike. Since November 20th, we've only seen \$11,000 in new pledges, bringing us to 72.3% of our diocesan goal, of which 67% has been received.

We are grateful for everyone's contributions, but we've still got quite a distance to go to meet the needs identified in this year's appeal.

When you take the parish project goals into account, only one parish has met both its share of the diocesan goal and its parish project goal: St. Patrick's in McBride. St. Mary's PG and St. Joseph's Smithers are both 75% of the way to their total combined goals.

Our Lady of Snows in Fort St. James, Resurrection Parish in Fort St. John, Holy Cross in Tumbler Ridge, St. Anthony's in Houston, and Sacred Heart Cathedral all made good additions to their totals.

We continue to ask for your support for the Appeal. We had a good start but still have some distance to go to reach our financial goal. Please continue to pray for the needs of the entire diocese and, if you are able, please consider contributing or adding to your contribution.

Announcement – Pilgrim Locations in the Diocese of Prince George for the 2025 Jubilee

Pope Francis has urged pilgrimages to Rome, local churches and shrines in the coming Jubilee 2025.

Since many cannot travel to Rome for a pilgrimage, bishops worldwide designated their cathedrals and shrines as special places of prayer for pilgrims.

Three churches and a special place in the Diocese of Prince George are designated by Bishop Stephen Jensen as destinations for pilgrims (please see attached poster):

- Sacred Heart Cathedral, Prince George
- Notre Dame Parish, Dawson Creek
- Sacred Heart Parish, Terrace
- Rose Prince Gravesite, Lejac

These churches and the Rose Prince gravesite will serve as places of pilgrimage within the diocese throughout the Ordinary Jubilee Year 2025. Jubilee pilgrimages offer the faithful the occasion to receive a plenary indulgence under the usual conditions: sacramental confession, Eucharistic communion, and prayer for the intentions of the Holy Father.

The Holy Father stated in the Papal Bull, **Spes Non Confundit**, "Pilgrimage is of course a fundamental element of every Jubilee event. Setting out on a journey is traditionally associated with our human quest for meaning in life. A pilgrimage on foot is a great aid for rediscovering the value of silence, effort and simplicity of life. In the coming year, pilgrims of hope will surely travel the ancient and more modern routes in order to experience the Jubilee to the full...In the particular Churches, special care should be taken to prepare priests and the faithful to celebrate the sacrament of Confession and to make it readily available in its individual form."

The Jubilee of Hope will officially open on December 24^{th,} 2024, with the Pope opening the "Holy Door" in St. Peter's Basilica.

In our diocese, Bishop Stephen Jensen will celebrate the 11:00 AM Mass at Sacred Heart Cathedral as the solemn opening of the Jubilee Year on Sunday, December 29^{th,} 2024, Feast of The Holy Family of Jesus, Mary, and Joseph. Join us for an evening of live music, silent auctions, delicious Christmas goods and much more!


Rachel's Vineyard News Update


